Lubelskie Voivodeship is the leader in growing many plants, vegetables and fruit:

hops -83% of national production, tobacco -43% of national production, raspberries -75% of national production, currants -32% of national production, strawberries -18% of national production, sugar beet -13% of national production, potatoes -8% of national production

Manufacturers from Lubelskie Voivodeship have 134 registered traditional products, which gives them 5th place in Poland and confirms the high quality of products.

for the development of the organic food sector: agricultural land represent 70.8% of the region area, 8% of the land is class I-II, forests cover 22.8% of the province. Approximately 1,711 licensed farms in the region produce organic food based on the plant and animal eco-production method.







Lublin – we focus on a bio-based economy

Bioeconomy is a key smart specialisation of Lubelskie Voivodeship, included in the Regional Innovation Strategy until 2020. This specialisation includes activities based on biotechnologies, including high-quality food production, use of bioenergy and biomedical production¹⁾

- Sectors comprising bioeconomy make up 28% of gross added value of Lubelskie Voivodeship, and employ 45% of workers in the region
- Bioeconomy covers all sectors that produce, process or use biological resources in any form,²⁾ including:
 - Animal and plant products
 - Agri-food processing
 - Pharmaceutical and chemical industry
 - Renewable energy
 - Environmental services



Naturally, healthy and safe for the environment

- The area of organic farms in Lubelskie Voivodeship was over 40,000 hectares in 2013, which places the province in 7th position in Poland







The number of pupils in the school year 2013/2014 in Lublin's vocational schools in fields related to the food industry, broken down into subregions




Science and technology parks and industrial parks are separate sets of buildings with technical infrastructure, created to facilitate the transfer of knowledge and technology between academia and enterprise

- Technical facilities: a total usable area of approx. 100,000 m², 43 companies employing about 1,100 workers, 10 ha of vacant land plots to be used for development with access to technical and roadinfrastructure. 5,000 m² space for production and services



Government grants

Government grants are awarded on the basis of the "Support programme for investments of high importance to the Polish economy for 2011–2020", adopted by the Council of Ministers on 5 July 2011.

Form of support

- Support is in the form of a subsidy granted on the basis of a bilateral agreement concluded between the Minister of the Economy and the investor, precisely setting out the terms of paying a grant.
- The Programme is addressed to businesses who plan to make investments in priority sectors for the Polish economy:
 - 1 Automotive sector
 - 2 Electronic sector and household appliances sector
 - 3 Aviation sector
 - 4 Biotechnology sector
 - 5 Agri-food sector
 - 6 Sector of modern services
 - Research and development activity (R&D)



New investment support programme is implemented in two categories:

- · For creating new jobs
- · For starting a new investment

Forms and levels of support:

- Depends on the number of points gained at the assessment of new investment in the application process
- Grants vary from PLN 7,700 (~ EUR 1,842) to PLN 10,640 (~ EUR 2545) for one newly created job

Assessment criteria:

- Rate of employees with a university degree
- · Location in a poviat with a high unemployment rate
- Value of investment expenditures
- · Sector in which the activity is conducted
- Other (innovation level, positive impact on the neighbourhood)

EU funds

Poland is the largest beneficiary of EU funds

Financial means allocated to Poland under the agricultural policy for 2014–2020 amount to **EUR 28.5 billion**. The amount allocated under the Cohesion Policy is **EUR 72.9 billion**

- Minimal value of capital expenditures - EUR 100,000

Real property tax rates are determined individually by each commune based on enterprise investment plans

Property tax exemption concerns:

- Ancillary buildings or their parts
 - helping forestry or fishing activity,
 - located on land farms, intended solely for agricultural activities,
 - used for special branches of agricultural production
- Businesses holding the status of an R&D centre, obtained on the terms set out in provisions on certain forms of supporting innovative activity in relation to taxed objects used for the purposes of research and development
- Land constituting wasteland, ecological areas, wooded and shrub land, except land intended for business purposes

Industrial/commercial land	PLN 0.90/m ² per year
Industrial/commercial building	PLN 23.13/m ² per year




